Our schools

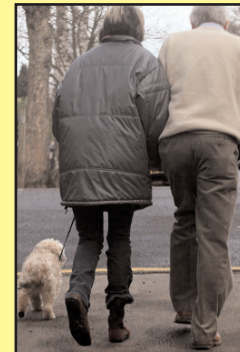
Labour will address the long-term inequalities in educational attainment across the county.
